2012 Highlights

- ✓ 20 volunteer Health Care professionals and Spanish translators provided 3996 Health Care services to guests via 8-10 Free Clinics per month!
- ✓ Over 40 key volunteers provided over 3300 hours of volunteer time equating to \$91,773 Value of Volunteer Service Time.

We envision a community where suffering is alleviated, Where health and healing are available to all.

- This breaks down as follows: \$43,614.70 in Clinical Value for Volunteer Service Time and \$48,158.55 Non-Clinical Value for Volunteer Service Time.
- ✓ 299 Physician or Nurse Practitioner visits were provided at no cost.
- ✓ 399 Nurse visits were provided at no cost.
- ✓ Over 240 health service referrals were made.
 - These included: Dental Aid, People's Clinic, Clinica Campesina, Mammography, Urgent Care and the Emergency Room.
- ✓ In partnership with Boulder Community Hospital 19 patients received flu shots at no cost.
- Harvey: "I am glad you [SBHHM] are here, because it really helps!"
- ✓ In partnership with the American Diabetes Association, 14 Spanish speakers graduated from the Stanford based, Chronic Disease Self-Management program in October, at no cost to the individual.
- ✓ Participation in Holy Saturday Foot Washing with First Presbyterian Church.
- ✓ In-Kind donations such as handmade hats, socks, personal care items, medical supplies, dental supplies, medications and office supplies exceeded \$5386 in value.



Executive Director's Report

Rev. Sally Bowersox

2012 has been an exciting year for St. Benedict Health and Healing Ministry (SBHHM). While the stressed national, state and local economy has created challenges for the ministry as well as the people we serve, we have found and welcomed much abundance. In February this year our 7th Annual Heart Art Fundraiser brought in over \$23,000! With the tremendous assistance of our grant writer, more grants were received than in any year to date.

An outstanding highlight of 2012 was the expansion of our Free Clinics. In January we began a partnership with Trinity Lutheran Church in Boulder offering a Free Clinic every second Sunday



during their luncheon for the homeless. And in June a Free Clinic began at First Congregational Church in Boulder every 4th Sunday during their luncheon for the homeless. Presently, SBHHM offers a Free Clinic every Thursday at Sister Carmen Community Center's Food Bank and during the above luncheons for the homeless at various church locations. In December SBHHM began collaborating with the Our Center in Longmont, where we plan to begin offering regular Free Clinics to their population twice per month. The target start date is 7 February 2013.

Aaron: With a family history of diabetes, he appreciates "testing is available to those who need help." Through a new partnership with the American Diabetes Association, the first class of Spanish speakers graduated from the Stanford based, Chronic Disease Self-Management (CDSM) Program in October. We are excited to look toward offering both CDSM and Diabetes Prevention classes in 2013. The Board of Directors welcomed Mr. Jay Millard, Mr. Matt

Kapinus, Mr. Bill Ashworth, and Dr. Julie Ansell. Dr. Ansell, a physician volunteer with SBHHM, also stepped into the role of Medical Director, bringing a depth of medical experience as well as wisdom and oversight. Ms. Kris Bertness graciously accepted the invitation to serve as Assistant Treasurer and Bookkeeper, bringing years of experience in these positions.

Mr. Mike Anderson came on board as consulting attorney to the organization. Ms. Jen Urbonas is serving as our much needed Volunteer Coordinator. Several new volunteer health care professionals joined the SBHHM team: Meagan Chandler, Elizabeth Cruse, Rebecca Fellows, Linda Jensen, Lori Johnson-Berke, Colleen Keller, Camille Moore, Gay Lynn Olsen, and Kay Weltzin.









Medical Services Breakdown and Patient Residency Demographics

Imagine being faced every day with the difficult choice of providing food, shelter, or health care for yourself and your family. Do I buy groceries, pay the rent, get a mammogram, or buy the prescription medicine my child needs? This is reality to the over 40,000 medically underserved adults here in Boulder County. Saint Benedict Health and Healing Ministry provides a safety net to these individuals - providing them access to our free medical clinics and helping them get connected to a medical home where they may obtain additional services at an affordable rate.

SBHHM made great progress over the course of 2012 in providing significantly more services to

the medically underserved and in strengthening our internal infrastructure for future success. In 2012 we welcomed on four new Board Members, including a new Medical Director, a number of new medical volunteers, a new volunteer coordinator, a new assistant treasurer/bookkeeper, and a consultant attorney.

We are well positioned to achieve the challenging, exciting goals set out in our 2013 thru 2015 Strategic Plan. These include:

✓ Increase the number of clinics to twenty or more per month by the end of 2015;

- ✓ Expand our Operations to include free medical clinics in Longmont, which has the largest number of working poor and homeless of any City in Bolder County;
- ✓ More fully implement our Healthy Living Program to better educate and support our clients who are managing a chronic disease; and
- ✓ Determine what barriers to health care our clients have, doing our best to help them address these barriers so that they can take full advantage of the medical care that is available to them.

Medical Director's Annual Report 2012

A lot has happened in 2012 for St Benedict Health and Healing Ministry! After a long period of service to the ministry as medical director, Dr. Shevaun Duiker passed on this role to me mid-year and continues with St Benedict as a valued physician volunteer.

2012 saw us greatly expand the number of services provided to our clients, by increasing our

We are thankful to be able to attend the Boulder downtown Soup Kitchens three Sundays each month, continue our presence at Sister Carmen/food bank, and are eager to move forward with expansion of our clinical screening services to Longmont and eastern Boulder County. Through our collaboration with the local chapter of the American Diabetes Association, we have been able to offer our clients at Sister Carmen Center a recognized and very successful diabetes education class, and look forward to offering more classes in 2013. We compiled our first healthy cookbook for our clients, in English and Spanish. We continue our efforts to reach out to local health care organizations to improve communication in hope of

connecting more of our clients to a medical home.

2012 was a year of organization and standardization, of clinical procedures and efforts at volunteer recruitment and retention. As we grow, we recognized the need to be able to track our successes and analyze our efforts. We have reviewed and confirmed our mission and goals. We have instituted a new wellness flow sheet at one of our locations. We have welcomed several new clinical and non-clinical volunteers. There have been some bumps on the road along the way, but overall I am so looking forward to 2013 and continuing in our goal of caring for and making personal connections with our clients, of educating and helping them towards better health and well-being.



Treasurer's Annual Report 2012 Dr. Larry Burgess

The financial situation for St. Benedict Health and Healing Ministry (SBHHM) at the end of 2012 was good. Overall spending in 2012 was below budget while income matched budget, resulting in a surplus of around \$4,500.

In the last three years, the ministry's sources of income have shifted away from church-based donations and more toward public and private grants. In 2012, these grants, church giving and individual donations contributed 55%, 11% and 34% of our total income, respectively. Ultimately, we hope to balance our sources of income more evenly by increasing individual donations and church giving.
